More than 500 cows graze on lush Irish meadows on the 300-hectare farm, half of which are dairy cows that are hooked up to one of Ireland’s most modern rotary milking systems twice a day. Children holidaying here love to watch the cows being milked and stroke the little calves, or go off and seek adventure in the tree house, bounce around on the trampoline or play a spot of table tennis.
